

- I. We are called to a holy walk because God is holy (v. 5)
 - A. God's holiness is seen in his transcendent majesty
 - B. God's holiness is seen in his glorious splendor
 - C. God's holiness is seen in his moral purity

"But just as he who called you is holy, so be holy in all you do; for it is written: 'Be holy, because I am holy.'" (I Peter 1:15-16)

- II. We are called to stop walking in the darkness (v. 6)
 - A. If we live as hypocrites we are lying

"This is the verdict: Light has come into the world, but men loved darkness instead of light because their deeds were evil." (John 3:19)

- B. If we live as hypocrites we have rejected the truth

- III. We are called to a holy walk with God (v. 7)

- A. As we walk in the light we enjoy fellowship with God

"Blessed are those who have learned to acclaim you, who walk in the light of your presence, O Lord." (Psalm 89:15)

- B. As we walk in the light we enjoy fellowship with other believers
- C. As we walk in the light we are being purified from sin

- 1. The purification from sin is only by the blood of Jesus

"Come now, let us reason together, says the Lord. 'Though your sins are like scarlet, they shall be as white as snow.'" (Isaiah 1:18)

- 2. The purification from sin is a present & ongoing reality

- IV. We are called to be honest about sin (v. 8)

- A. If we reject the truth of our sinful nature we are deceived
- B. If we reject the truth of our sinful nature we ignore the truth

- V. We are called to confess our sins (v. 9)

- A. To confess is to agree with God in regard to our sin
- B. When we confess our sins God will forgive the sinful act

“In him we have redemption through his blood, the forgiveness of sins, in accordance with the riches of God’s grace.”
(Ephesians 1:7)

C. When we confess our sins God will cleanse the sinful stain

VI. We are called to not deny our need of forgiveness (v. 10)

A. This attitude rejects the holiness of God

B. This attitude rejects the truth of God
