- I. The Holy Spirit came at Pentecost (v. 1a)
 - A. Pentecost was an Old Testament feast fulfilled
 - 1. It celebrates a new harvest

"Count off fifty days up to the day after the seventh Sabbath, and then present an offering of new grain to the Lord." (Leviticus 23:16)

"Those who accepted his message were baptized, and about three thousand were added to their number that day." (Acts 2:41)

2. It celebrates Jesus as the bread of life

"From wherever you live, bring two loaves made of two-tenths of an ephah of fine flour, baked with yeast, as a wave offering of firstfruits to the Lord." (Leviticus 23:17)

3. It celebrates the fulfillment of Jesus' promise

"Do not leave Jerusalem, but wait for the gift my Father promised, which you have heard me speak about." (Acts 1:4)

- II. The believers were waiting in obedience to Jesus (v. 1b)
- III. The believers were filled with the Holy Spirit (v. 2-4)
 - A. They heard the sound of a violent wind

"Then he said to me, 'Prophesy to the breath; prophesy, son of man, and say to it, 'This is what the Sovereign Lord says: Come from the four winds, o breath, and breathe into these slain, that they may live." (Ezekiel 37:9)

- 1. The Holy Spirit is God
- 2. The Holy Spirit is powerful

"I pray that out of his glorious riches he may strengthen you with power through his Spirit in your inner being." (Ephesians 3:16)

- 3. The Holy Spirit is omnipresent
- B. They saw tongues of fire

"I looked, and I saw a windstorm coming out of the north – an immense cloud with flashing lightning and surrounded by brilliant light." (Ezekiel 1:4)

1. The Holy Spirit purifies our hearts

"But who can endure the day of his coming? Who can stand when he appears? For he will be like a refiner's fire." (Malachi 3:2)

2. The Holy Spirit empowers our lives

"You will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you." (Acts 1:8)

3. The Holy Spirit <u>fills us</u> individually

"I will give you a new heart and put a new spirit in you; I will remove from you your heart of stone and give you a heart of flesh. And I will put my Spirit in you and move you to follow my decrees and be careful to keep my laws." (Ezekiel 36:26-27)

- C. They were enabled to speak in other languages
 - 1. This gift enabled them to begin to reach the world
- IV. The believers experienced powerful impact (v. 5-13)
 - A. Jews from all nations were <u>present</u>

"You will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." (Acts 1:8)

- B. They were amazed at hearing their own languages
- C. They heard about the wonders of God
- D. Their message with met with seekers and mockers
