  - B. David sees clearly what must be done
  - C. David had prepared for this moment

"But now your kingdom will not endure; the Lord has sought after a man after his own heart and appointed him leader of his people, because you have not kept the Lord's command." (I Samuel 13:14)

- D. David <u>volunteered</u> to fight Goliath
- E. David had faith that God would give him victory

"The Lord is my light and my salvation – whom shall I fear? The Lord is the stronghold of my life – of whom shall I be afraid?" (Psalm 27:1)

- III. The man of faith versus the giant (v. 38-51)
  - A. David uses the <u>weapons</u> he has
  - B. Goliath demeans and threatens David
  - C. David proclaims his faith in God
    - 1. By faith he comes in the name of the Lord

"I can do everything through him who gives me strength." (Philippians 4:13)

2. By faith he sees Goliath <u>already dead</u>

"Now faith is being sure of what we hope for and certain of what we do not see." (Hebrews 11:1)

3. By faith he sees God fighting the <u>battle</u>

"The Lord will fight for you; you need only to be still" (Exodus 14:14)
