- \*Picture of view from Mt. Carmel
  - A. Elijah challenged the people to get off the fence

"But if serving the Lord seems undesirable to you, then choose for yourselves this day whom you will serve." (Joshua 24:15)

- B. Elijah challenged the people to <u>follow</u> the true God
- C. Elijah was not afraid to stand alone

"Be strong and courageous. Do not be terrified; do not be discouraged, for the Lord your God will be with you wherever you go." (Joshua 1:9)

- D. Elijah proposes a test to reveal the true God
- III. The confidence of Elijah (v. 25-29)
  - A. He listened as the prophets called on their false god
  - B. He mocked the false prophets and their false god
  - C. He saw the people lose interest
- IV. The faith of Elijah (v. 30-38)
  - A. Elijah called the people to see the power of God
  - B. Elijah repaired the altar and prepared the sacrifice
  - C. Elijah poured water on everything making it impossible to burn
  - D. Elijah prayed a prayer of faith

- E. Elijah saw God answer with fire
- V. The response of the people (v. 39-40)
  - A. They saw the power of God

"Your ways, O God, are holy. What god is so great as our God? You are the God who performs miracles; you display your power among the peoples." (Psalm 77:13-14)

B. They <u>humbled</u> themselves before God

"Let all the earth fear the Lord; let all the people of the world revere him." (Psalm 33:8)

- C. They confessed that the Lord was God
- D. They repented of their <u>sin</u>
