The Glory of a Rejected Savior

Acts 7:1-59

Stephen defended his faith by clarifying what faith in God is.

- 1. Vs. 1-7 Abraham was considered to be the Father of Faith because he <u>acted obediently</u> to what God promised.
- 2. Vs. 8 God confirmed the promise through the <u>covenant</u> of circumcision.
- 3. Vs. 9-16 God would fulfill his promise through a <u>'Rejected Savior'.</u> Joseph
- 4. Vs. 17-20 God never lost sight of his children. the homeless slaves
- 5. Vs. 20-29 God would fulfill his promise through a <u>'Rejected Child..</u> Moses
- 6. Vs. 30-34 God never lost sight of his plan to save the person whom he chose. <u>The Rejected</u> <u>Savior</u> – Moses
- 7. Vs. 35-38 Moses the rejected became Moses, the ruler, the judge and the prophet of God.
- 8. Vs. 39-43 Even when God gave his life giving Law, the people were <u>rejecting</u> God.
- 9. Vs. 44-50 God's plan for a place of worship was a Tabernacle. Man's plan was for a Temple which was never to be a substitute for the <u>Temple of God</u> in heaven.
- 10. Vs. 51 52 Stephen represents the history of the Rejected Prophets
- 11. Vs. 52 53 Stephen now proclaims the real sin of rejecting, betraying and murdering the <u>Messiah, the Savior of All</u>, God himself, Jesus Christ.

Stephen has framed the history of God and his people around Saving Faith
