1. God's love is a giving love

"For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son so that whoever believes in him will not perish but have eternal life." (John 3:16)

- 2. God's love is a sacrificial love
- 3. God's love is an unselfish love
- B. By doing good things for them

"If your enemy is hungry, give him food to eat, it he is thirsty, give him water to drink." (Proverbs 25:21)

- C. By giving them a blessing
- D. By giving them prayer

"Jesus said, 'Father forgive them, for they do not know what they are doing.' And they divided up his clothes by asting lots." (Luke 23:34)

E. By not seeking <u>retaliation</u>

"Make sure that nobody pays back wrong for wrong, but always try to be kind to each other and to everyone else." (I Thessalonians 5:15)

- F. By being generous
- G. By treating them as you would <u>like to be treated</u>
